Practice Nurse

Nurse Practitioner

Fiona can assess and examine you, make a diagnosis and provide advice and treatment including a prescription if required. She can refer to hospital specialists, initiate investigations and admit patients to hospital where necessary.

Routine Appointments

All GPs, including registrars, have a broad knowledge of all medical and surgical specialities and deal with the full range of illnesses presented. For this reason we ask patients presenting with acute problems such as ear ache, conjunctivitis or a sore throat for example to make an appointment at our daily surgery with a non-specified clinician. If you would prefer to have your appointment later in the week, we will do our best to book you in with the next available clinician.

Named Doctor Appointments

As the modern GP now looks after a range of chronic conditions that were previously cared for in hospital clinics such as Hypertension, Diabetes, Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD) and Asthma, there will be some instances where patients with such conditions require continuity of care and who need to see their regular doctor. Patients requiring such continuity will be given follow-up appointment slips by their GP when making their next appointment.

Please note, for patients who do not have follow-up appointment slips, due to demand, the waiting time to see a named Doctor will be longer than it is for a routine appointment with a non-specified clinician.
